#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Summer provides us with a slower pace and a chance to do things a little differently in the church. Not long ago I was meeting with our new Outreach Committee (formerly called Evangelism). The subject of the importance of knowing our beliefs as Presbyterians came up in our meeting and how often we struggle with knowing what we believe and why we believe it. Increasingly our society values the languages of science and computers, of medicine and economics, and we are less knowledgeable about God and Christ and the ethics that are informed by our faith. People may know that they struggle with a moral decision in our society, or they may know they are uncomfortable with the theology of a neighbor, and yet not know how to talk about why they believe a different theological position.

This summer I will be preaching a sermon series on Presbyterian beliefs, entitled, **This I Believe**. Starting June 9, with Pentecost Sunday when we go to our summer schedule of unified worship at 10:00 am, I will preach each Sunday this summer with three exceptions on a series of different Presbyterian beliefs. Those exceptions are July 7, when I will take a Sunday of vacation time, July 21 when we will have Soccer Camp Sunday, and August 11 which will be our Glorious Return Sunday. From June 9 to August 25, we will highlight a comprehensive overview of Presbyterian Beliefs (see schedule below). If your vacation takes you out of town any of these weeks and you would like to familiarize yourself with the sermon you missed, or if you want a friend or family member to learn about Presbyterian beliefs, check us out on You Tube.






Come to worship the one who heals us, who frees us, who calls us... to live life in peace and grace.





#### **SESSION HIGHLIGHTS**

A full copy of the following Session Minutes is available on the bulletin board across from the Office Manager's office. Detailed committee reports are also available. Some committee highlights will be contained in various parts of these reports. However, since Session reports are posted in their entirety, information in this newsletter is presented in an abbreviated format, containing only important motions and other pertinent information.

### Stated Session Meeting Minutes March 24, 2019

#### **Treasurer's Report (Steve Martinat)**

Steve presented the financial statements through February 28, 2019. Revenues were \$53,750. Expenses were \$75,497, resulting in a \$21,747 shortfall. The prorated (16.6%) approved budget deficit offset is \$8,813 which leaves a budget shortfall of \$12,934. Steve said that we are about the same as a year ago for revenue and expenses. Steve presented a summary of activity in the Restricted Accounts, a summary of revenue and expenses for the General Fund, and the Balance Sheet. Steve answered all questions about these funds.

Motion: To let the director of "From this Day Forward" outdoor drama reside in the Gingerbread House for the 2019 season of rehearsals and performances. During this time, the house would be subject to periodic inspections by church staff and the Property Committee of the church.

Motion to approve \$5,707.00 from 2% fund request submitted by Property Committee to be used for physical improvements to the Tron House property in preparation for the new Media Based Sunday School/Outreach program.

Motion to approve \$6600.00 from 2% fund request submitted by Property Committee to be used to have a gas line and gas furnace installed in the church sanctuary.

Motion: To endorse the building and growth of the Ruth Williams Scholarship

Motion: To approve the ROAR curriculum for VBS 2019.

Motion: The Personnel Committee of Waldensian Presbyterian Church recommends the employment of Coron Jordan as Kitchen Coordinator. The annual salary for this position will be as follows:

- \$19.500
- \$1,000 Travel Allowance

The employment categorization of the position will be variable part-time non-exempt (time sheet required).

Ms. Jordan will begin her employment at WPC during late April – early May 2019.

Motion: Approve the revised job description for the DCE (included in Session packet).

#### **Other News**

The acolytes are doing an excellent job and we are receiving many positive comments about having them in our services.

A temporary person has been hired to fill the financial secretary position.

We have several beautiful music programs scheduled for the Easter Season.

The new Child Protection Policy has been drafted and needs review of the full CA committee. The completed document should be ready for review by Session at the April meeting.

A formal list of M.A.D.E. 5 funds to be distributed to certain agencies has been given to Rev. Frederick for disbursement. Committees are reviewing architectural plans for restroom renovations in Pioneer Hall.

John Cannon Clerk of Session Minutes of the Called Meetings of the 8:30 Connections Service Congregation and the 10:55 AM Traditional Service Congregation March 31, 2019

Immediately following both the 8:30 AM Connections worship service in Pioneer Hall and the 10:55 AM Traditional worship service in the Waldensian Presbyterian Church sanctuary, as moderator, Rev. Kevin Frederick opened the congregational meetings with prayer. John Cannon, Clerk of Session, noted that a quorum was present in each service.

Rev. Frederick stated the purpose of the meeting was to elect one remaining representative to the Officer Nominating Committee for 2019. He stated that all members of the Officer Nominating Committee, except for a representative from the Missions Committee, had been elected the previous week at the combined service. Jeanene Burris has volunteered to be the representative from the Missions Committee and is being presented here for confirmation from the congregations.

The moderator asked for the vote of all those in favor of electing Jeanene Burris as a representative from the Missions Committee to serve on the Officer Nominating Committee for 2019. The decision of the congregation was unanimous.

There being no other business, the meetings of both congregations were adjourned by prayer and the benediction by the moderator at 9:30 AM at the Connections service and at 12:00 PM for the 11:00 AM worship service.
