Spring is in the air, and so is WPC music! Our Connections and Circle of Strings bands are alternating Sunday afternoons at 2:00 for outdoor rehearsals, wind and pollen currently presenting some challenges, but we press on. Middle school youth are beginning rehearsals (dialogue and songs) for 'Oh, Jonah!' on Sunday afternoons at 4:30 just before their youth meeting. And I'm hoping/planning to get our pre-K through middle elementary children to come on Wednesdays just for 15 minutes from 5:15 to 5:30pm (outdoors) so that they can practice singing a couple of 'Oh, Jonah!' songs when families come to pick up their meals. For that short a time, we'll ask their adults just to wait for them.

We are recording much of the Sunday worship service on Wednesday afternoons from 4:00 to 5:00. Chancel Choir has begun rehearsing outdoors from 6:00 to 6:45pm on Wednesdays, too. Our two 6-person handbell ensembles meet on Wednesday mornings at 11:00 and Thursday evenings at 6:15. We have persevered and continued to provide music for our worship throughout this long Pandemic, and now with spring weather and the growing benefit of vaccines, we are able to expand what we offer, ever reaching toward eventual normalcy.

In the spirit of all the above, I close with a hymn text, "Sing to God as Sings the Ocean" by my favorite hymn writer (and an eloquent theologian), Thomas Troeger. John Frye's recent sermon on "doubting" Thomas called it to my mind. "Sing to God as sings the ocean, Sing as birds that greet the dawn, Sing as windswept trees in motion, Sing and let your song be drawn from God's vast and whole creation, From your faith and doubt and fears, From rebirth and recreation,

From life's wealth of joy and tears.

- "Sing the heart's deep sighing sorrow to the Lord who hears lament,
- Who at midnight sees tomorrow when the dark at last is spent.

Sing to God who in our sadness brings the news of coming light,

Ample hope to waken gladness and sustain us through the night.

"Sing the great, glad joy of Jesus! Sing the gospel that Christ brings. Sing the way Christ heals and feeds us,

Sing the song that Easter sings: Christ is risen, Christ is living, Christ among us, Christ within, Christ the spring of endless giving where new songs of faith begin."

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS

Stated Session Meeting Minutes February 28, 2021

A full copy of the Session Minutes is available on the bulletin board across from the Office Manager's office. Detailed committee reports are also available. Some committee highlights will be contained in various parts of this report. However, since Session reports are posted in their entirety, information in this newsletter is presented in an abbreviated format, containing only important motions and other pertinent information.

(Clerk's note: This meeting was held as a Zoom online conference meeting to adhere to public health guidelines for "social distancing").

Treasurer's Report (Steve Martinat)

Steve reviewed the Summary of Revenues and Expenses for January 1, 2021 through January 31, 2021. He said that actual revenue was \$31,043. Expenses were \$49,383 which produces a shortfall of \$18,340. After applying the approved budget offset of \$4,283, the net shortfall would be \$14,057. Steve said that this is normal for this time of the year. Steve reviewed the Restricted Accounts and the Balance Sheet, which shows balanced assets and liabilities of \$7,262,123. Steve then answered several questions from elders.

Order of the Day: (Steve Martinat)

Cemetery Request - see attached email from Steve Martinat and letter from Carol Anne Guigou Moehring

Steve presented a request from Carol Anne Guigou Moehring in reference to the burial of ashes on the grave site of her father and mother, John and Betty Lou Guigou.

The deceased, Philip Leon of France, was a foreign exchange student who lived with the Guigou family in the 1970's. One of his wishes was to have his ashes buried with Carol Anne's parents. The family is also requesting a marker for Mr. Leon be placed at the grave site. Because he was not a member of the family or of Waldensian Presbyterian Church, this burial would not be permitted without approval from WPC Session.

After discussion by the elders, the following motion was made by David and seconded by Debbie:

Motion: To approve the request of the burial of some of Philip Leon's ashes in an approved urn and vault on the Guigou family cemetery plot, if cemetery plot will accommodate a small marker, and that all Guigou family members agree with this burial.

A vote was called by the moderator and the motion was approved with 7 "yes" votes and 4 "no" votes. One Session member was absent.

Approved Motions (other than routine):

Motion: Current regulations regarding WPC indoor worship services, special services, classes, and meetings will remain in place until further notice from the WPC Session.

The Session asks the <u>Worship</u> <u>Committee</u> and the <u>Christian Action</u> <u>Committee</u> work together with appropriate staff and supporting committees and explore the possibility of making a proposal at the April or May 2021 Session meetings on how the church might offer an <u>outdoor</u> unified Worship Service and Children's nursery beginning June 6, 2021. This target date is subject to change based on the vagaries of the COVID 19 virus.

The following parties should be included in this discussion and should communicate with each other:

- The entire Worship Committee, including the Ushering coordinator and the Video coordinator
- The entire Christian Action Committee, including the Children's Ministry subcommittee
- Staff members John Frye, Laurie Nicholson, Jason Adams, and Carla Sperry (Worship participants)
- Representatives from the Property Committee and staff member Fred Smith (set up and clean up)

The following issues should be addressed (and there certainly may be more):

- Starting time of outdoor worship (morning? evening?)
- Length of service
- Staff responsibilities prior to, during, and after service(s)
- Volunteer responsibilities prior to, during, and after service(s)
- Social Distancing
- Masks
- Needed supplies
- Alterations to outer campus

Other committees may also discuss and bring proposals to the March or April Session meetings for outdoor activities.

Motion: The Worship Committee is requesting the presence of two communion servers during the recording of the service for Thursday, April 1, 2021 (Maundy Thursday). Reverend Frye feels that this would be a symbolic connection for the congregation even though we are still meeting apart from each other. All present will wear a mask for that part of the service, and the 2 servers will sit on opposite sides of the chancel. There will be 4 people present: the pastor, the videographer, and the 2 servers.

Motion: To approve a drive-through Easter Egg Hunt and goodie basket pick-up for April 3, 2021.

Other News

The next Presbytery Meeting will be Tuesday, April 27, 2021, at the Montreat Conference Center in Montreat. Our commissioners to that meeting will be John Williams and David Fletcher. Reverend Frye will also attend.

Rev. Frye discussed the Officers' retreat and stated that we made good progress in moving toward the election of a Transition Team to complete a Mission Statement to be used in the call of a new pastor.

Judy Waldrop stated that her committee had given out 20 children's activity packets in January and 26 packets in February, and had received many positive comments about the packets.

Jeff Jacumin said that he, Steve Demiter, and Bart Bounous will be meeting on March 2, 2021 to begin discussions about the need of computer upgrades/replacements for several of the staff.

Willie Pascal, who delivers meals to shut-ins, had delivered 52 Valentine's treat bags to shut-ins.

Debbie Garrou said that James Fletcher, a member of our youth, had agreed to serve on the Missions Committee.

Mary-Louise Hatley submitted the following list of members of the New Officer Nominating Committee, for concurrence of Session, with approval of the congregation at the Congregational Meeting on March 21, 2021:

Minutes of the Called Meeting of the Congregation March 21, 2021 (Email Vote)

With governmental and public health restrictions because of the COVID-19 epidemic, this congregational meeting was held following the 11:00am YouTube worship service on March 21, 2021 to review an email vote by church members. The Rev. Dr. John Frye stated that the purpose of this meeting was to present a congregational vote on a motion to approve the New Officer Nominating Committee for new officers for the Class of 2024. The stated motion and narrative was emailed to the congregation on March 3, 2021. Rev. Frye announced the online vote at the online services of March 7, 2021 and March 14, 2021. It was requested that voting members of the congregation send their votes on the motion, "Yes" or "No", to Rita Spivey at office@waldpres.org no later than Wednesday, March 17, 2021. It is noted that a quorum for the congregational meeting would be 10% of the membership or 33 members. Please note that this was not a controversial vote, but normal step in nominating new officers to be approved by the congregation this October. The members were asked to vote "yes" or "no "on the following motion which comes from Mary-Louise Hatley, Chair of the Nominating Committee:
